Center for Worker Justice

Every year the Center for Worker Justice for Eastern lowa (CWJ) has a silent auction at its annual gala to raise money for the organization. This year the gala took place at the Unitarian-Universalist Society in Coralville Saturday, October 5th.

CWJ engages in diverse activities aimed at improving workers' opportunities and conditions, health, and housing of immigrants and lowwage workers and residents of our area.

This year we have been leading campaigns to fight bad immigration laws, while increasing focus on resisting the increasing wage theft and child labor exploitations. We empower members through organizing and by providing educational and training programs including language, literacy, and

business startup training. CWJ also expands exposure and accessibility of the members to resources such as medical clinics, Johnson County ID and, and by organizing sessions that inform about their legal rights. Johnson County Humane Society

Johnson County Humane Society (JCHS) has made significant strides in animal welfare, including subsidized spays and neuters through the Florence Unash Neuter Program, collaborating with lowa Humane Alliance and local vet clinics. We funded low-cost spay/neuter events for feral and barn cats, benefiting about 200 cats, and provided essential medical services at lowa Humane

Alliance Clinic.

JCHS supported additional medical needs at private vet clinics, engaged in



trap-neuter-return efforts, and collaborated on community outreach events with lowa Humane Alliance. We distributed donated pet food to cat colony managers, pet owners, and local food pantries, alongside maintaining active online and fundraising efforts.

Iowa Renewable Energy Association

The Iowa Renewable Energy Association's (I-Renew) mission is to make renewable and sustainable energy the primary source of energy in Iowa.

I-Renew regularly answers questions to community members who are interested in renewable energy. We have an active Facebook page where we share educational information about renewable energy and sustainability.



Friends of the Marion Public Library

The members of Friends of the Marion Public Library (FMPL) have been keeping busy in a number of ways. Our core group of about 32 volunteers keeps our Friends Bookstore open nearly every hour that the library is open each week. We have had so much good luck with donated books that we have temporarily run out of storage space! We also hold three large book sales each year in

the library community room. Our group also sponsors the local affiliate of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library (DPIL) for children from birth to age five in the 52302 zip code. Registered children receive a free book in the mail each month until they age out of the program, providing them with their own library, fostering a love of books, reading, and giving a boost to their skills prior to

kindergarten. Since taking on the program, over 44,400 books have been sent out to children in Marion. The Friends will be beginning a new fundraising initiative soon, aimed at developing sustaining donor partners to ensure we can continue to fund the DPIL program into the future.

Our Marion Library is anxiously awaiting the delivery of their new bookmobile at the end of July 2024. The Friends will be helping fund the advertising "wrap" for outside of the bookmobile and possibly some of the content for the bookmobile as well. This will be a very exciting and visible reminder of the importance of a community library.

Quad Cities Alliance for Immigrants & Refugees

The Quad Cities Alliance for Immigrants & Refugees (QCAIR) was founded in 2012. The initial need for QCAIR was a referral organization for immigrants and refugees to access the available resources. We have expanded our services and now offers education on becoming a citizen, free civic classes, and assistance for completing applications such as Medicaid, Snap, and other needs. QCAIR is starting to be a welcoming center. This will help people with accessing healthcare, assistance with finding employment, and housing. QCAIR also has a fund to assist our clients with their education and emergency needs.

For fiscal year 2023, QCAIR assisted 2142 individuals. We helped 868 individuals with applying for financial assistance. We assisted 427 individuals in receiving education on how to

become a citizen. We had 18 individuals complete our civic class. We served 801 individuals with accessing resources. We assisted 28 individuals with emergency applications to keep their lights and water on.

In fiscal year 2024, QCAIR is doubling our goal for individuals served for applications, assistants, and referrals. We will maintain the same goal for education and outreach for citizenship. This year our goal for applications for financial assistance is going to 350 as the program, guidelines, and qualifications have changed. We are looking to hire three full-time employees and three part-time employees to assist in meeting our

empower immigrants and refugees and educate the community on how immigrants and refugees build our society.

Every year QCAIR host an Honor's dinner to recognize and honor individuals who were foreign-born and chose to become US Citizens. This event is free to the public. QCAIR hosts a World Soccer Cup Tournament every year. For the last two years, we hosted a multicultural festival as well. This event has music, art, food from different cultures, entertainment and so much more.



Raptology

Raptology is excited to become the newest member of lowa Shares!

Raptology is a raptor and wildlife education group based in lowa City. We are licensed to house and care for unreleasable raptors and to use them for education. Raptology currently has seven education ambassadors that include three owl species, two hawks, a peregrine falcon, and a turkey vulture. In the past year,

schools, parks, senior centers, and libraries. Our live bird programs give the public

Linn County Chapter UNA-USA is proud to be able to support the lowa United Nations Association college ambassador program, which offers students at colleges and universities throughout lowa the opportunity to join advocacy efforts in support of the United Nations' work on human rights, global health, sustainable development, gender equity, and climate action.

Selected students each receive a stipend of \$500 and have significant opportunities

Animal Lifeline of Iowa

Animal Lifeline of Iowa (ALI), founded in 1986 outside of Carlisle, Iowa, is Central Iowa's only special needs, no-kill animal shelter, celebrating nearly 40 years of serving the Des Moines area and all of Iowa, We

rescue cats and dogs that are injured, handicapped, have a serious medical condition, are abused, are pregnant, are nursing moms, or are orphans that require bottle-feeding. We rehabilitate the animals, who run a
